Dharav MUN 2.0

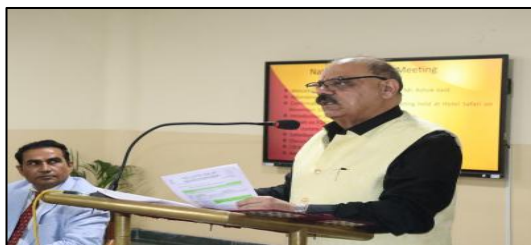

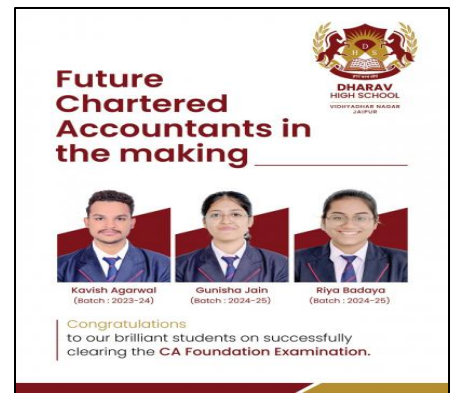
Yoga Session for Classes Pre Nursery to Prep

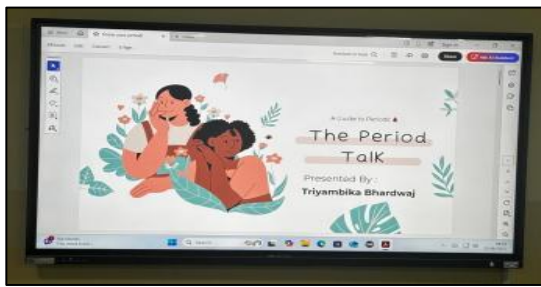
Inter-House Photography Competition: Celebrating Everyday Heroes

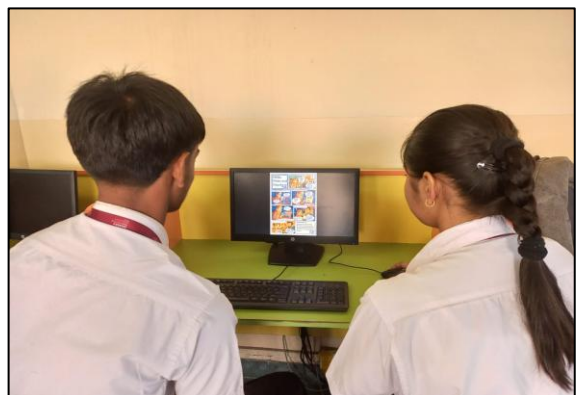
Diya Making Activity: Pre Nursery-II

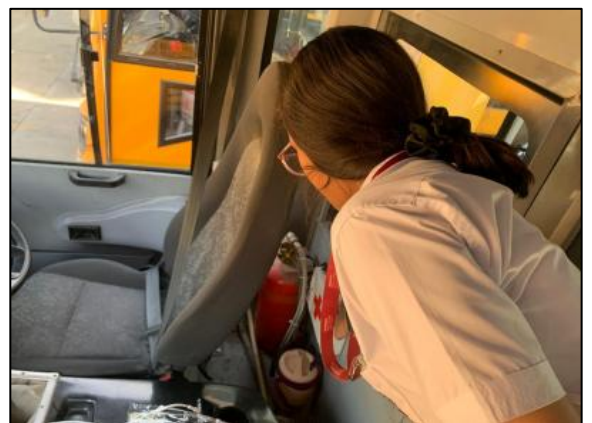
Light of Unity – Diwali Beyond Boundaries- Special Assembly : Grades I & II

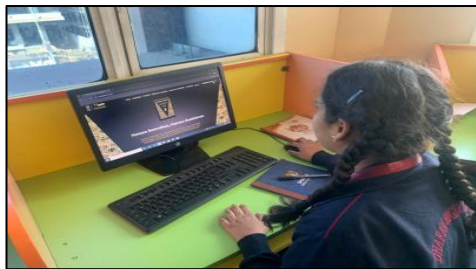
Space Explorers Workshop for Grades III-IX

Dharav Teachers' attended Teach Camp Organised by ScooNews

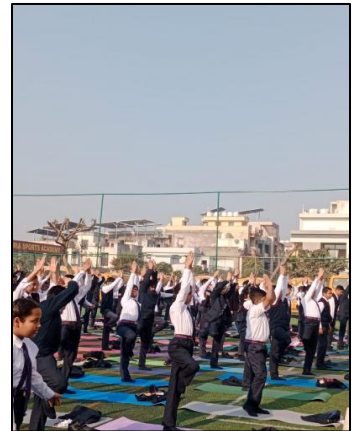

Rhythm of Words - Storytelling Activity: Grade III

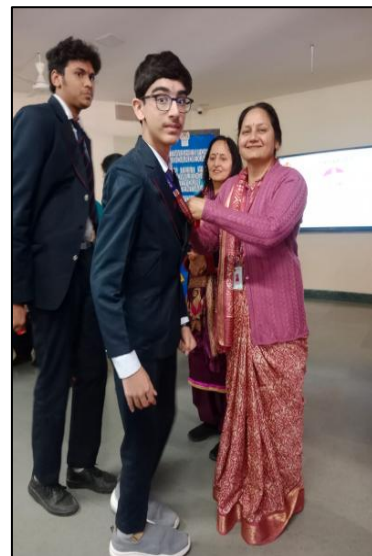
